IN DEPTH

A Rolex diving watch gets an update but keeps its signature style.



When Rolex introduced the Oyster Perpetual Submariner in 1953, it was the first diving watch that was waterproof to a depth of 330 feet. The brand's newest Submariner Date makes the case that good design needs little improvement. The 18-karat-gold timepiece, featuring a slightly larger case, a 70-hour power reserve and an extra-resilient ceramic called Cerachrom, remains a handy deep-water accessory: The rotatable bezel enables divers to monitor their diving time and decompression stops.
