

When Rolex introduced the Oyster **Perpetual Submariner** in 1953, it was the first diving watch that was waterproof to a depth of 330 feet. The brand's newest **Submariner Date** makes the case that good design needs little improvement. The 18-karat-gold timepiece, featuring a slightly larger case, a 70-hour power reserve and an extraresilient ceramic called Cerachrom, remains a handy deep-water accessory: The rotatable bezel enables divers to monitor their diving time and decompression stops.
